The Euell Wilson Center



Bishop Dwenger Hall of Famer, Euell Wilson, left a lasting impact not only on our school but our whole community. As a football stand-out, Wilson led the Saints to two consecutive State Championships. While he was well known for his athletic



ability, it was his kindhearted personality that people remember most. At the young age of 19, Wilson tragically died in his sleep. His mother, Shirley Woods, decided to honor his legacy in a way that would impact thousands of people for generations to come. Shirley's misery turned to ministry as she opened the Euell A. Wilson Center, a program in the southeast portion of town that cares for high-risk youth. On any given day, up to 150 kids ages 5-18 can count on the Euell Wilson Center for food, childcare, homework help, and a safe place to be. Celebrating 30 years of service through love, Bishop Dwenger is proud to be part of the center's history. For 30 years, Saints have bussed to the center several times each week to volunteer and tutor the children there. We all know Euell is smiling down on the legacy of faith and love he left behind. This year, the center has a goal of reaching \$80,000 in honor of Euell, who was #80.

Saints Alive!

As a nod to Bishop Dwenger's Diamond Jubilee, we hope to dazzle our guests at the 45th annual Saints Alive! Dinner and Auction with our theme, "Putting on the Glitz!" This year's chairpersons are Jason Fabini ('93), John Tippmann, Jr. ('86), and Joe Wharton ('87).

Spirit Shop Bishop Dwenger



Competition season began on September 23rd at the Mt. Vernon Invitational, providing opportunities





French Student Exchange

Established in 2017, the French student exchange program between BD and Saint Clotilde in Strasbourg offers a unique and unforgettable opportunity for students to immerse themselves in the daily life of each country. The cultural exchange extends beyond borders, with BD students exploring Strasbourg and Paris while their French counterparts visit Chicago.

This year, Madame Zelaznik led a group of 20 students, who particularly enjoyed the October visit, providing them with a chance to experience Halloween, which is not traditionally celebrated in France. During their stay, the students explored Chicago, visited the Auburn Car Museum, toured Shipshewana, and attended their first high school football game. Yet, the true highlight was the chance to connect with other teenagers, realizing the similarities and forming friendships that transcend continents. The farewell is often accompanied by heartfelt goodbyes and tears.

This spring marks BD's first trip back to Strasbourg and Paris since the onset of Covid. A group of 12 Dwenger students will partake in various experiences, including attending an Easter Mass in Paris, touring iconic landmarks such as Sacré Coeur and the Louvre, and exploring other attractions in the region. Following their time in Paris, they will stay with the French friends they made in October. Our students feel incredibly fortunate for this enriching opportunity to travel, create lasting connections, and revisit their newfound friends in France!

The Bishop Dwenger Speech and Debate Team has a rich history that spans decades, evolving under the guidance of dedicated coaches and passionate students. Del Nelson laid the foundation in the 1970s with just two students, and since then, the team has flourished into a powerhouse of oratory skill and intellectual prowess.

Martin Tierney (CCHS '53), who coached the team for several decades until 2000, set the stage for success. Carrie Bleeke and Timothy Leffers '72 continued the legacy, with Chad Chenowith eventually taking the reins in 2013. The coaching team expanded over the years, with former competitors Benjamin Clemmer '13, Dr. Paul Porter, and Larissa Porter joining to contribute their expertise.

Honoring the memory of their former coaches, Dwenger hosts two annual tournaments: the Martin Bisson Tierneyment in the fall and the Del Nelson Memorial Tournament in winter, which also serves as a Big Questions Debate National Qualifier.



Dwenger's commitment to excellence, both in and out of the competitive arena, cements its status as a powerhouse in high school speech and debate, leaving an indelible mark on the legacy of this venerable team.

life, Peggy, who survives. The two built a life filled with faith, love, and family,


